The \$1,000.00 goes to the association for the retention and training of new officials and is sponsored by Swede's daughter and son-in-law Mary and Tom Herche.



In memory of Ray Cummings, a football and basketball



PY&SF 2nd Annual Scholastic Award **Five Valley High Schools Honored**

For the second time, this past June at the Yakima Valley Sports Awards ceremony, the PY&SF presented five valley high schools with scholastic awards in the amount of \$300.00. Mike Carey of the Yakima Valley Sports Commission collected academic and team sports performance data from the Washington Interscholastic Athletic Association for the foundation to create the scholastic award. The WIAA awards points to all schools participating in its sanctioned activities for team performance as well as scholastic achievement. Sportsmanship is also a factor in the schools' earning points.

PY&SF created five classifications for the scholastic

award, deciding to recognize schools in the 1B/2B, 1A, 2A, 3A and 4A categories. High schools receiving the second year of the award are Sunnyside, Ellensburg, Eisenhower, Selah and Zillah.

Foundation to Honor the Past in 2015

Editor's note: The PY&SF Board of Directors will be honoring the 1964-65 Davis and Eisenhower teams at the 2015 Sports Legends Reunion. The Parker Field: '65 Boomer "High Hopes" article is the first story leading up to the June 12th event. Look for an article in the next issue featuring key athletes.

Parker Field: '65 Boomers "High Hopes" By Spud Edmondson

Yakima's first boomer athletes ('46 & '47) grew up dreaming of playing at old Parker Field, a wooden/concrete edifice that burned down in '66. It was built by Shirley Parker (Daryl's father) in 1938 and was a youngster's delight with lots of character, smells and nooks and crannies that fueled our imagination.

Parker was home to the Bears ("A" league baseball), YVC football/baseball, Ike/Davis football, Legion baseball, junior high football championship and, most important to youngsters then, the annual YMCA pee-wee championships/ all star games. Our first opportunity to play there came in the third grade ('56), but we imagined playing there from the time we watched games in the early '50s.

The last game we played there was August 1965, the Yakima Legion team winning the district playoff game to state. Over those nine years, numerous baseball games and a junior high football championship were held there, but high school football moved to Zaepfel Stadium in 1962.

Parker was rebuilt after the fire and was still the place to play baseball for Yakima's youth, fueling all the younger boomers' "High Hopes." PY&SF's connection remains strong, and we are very proud of the recent announcement changing the name to "Parker-Faller Field," honoring Bill Faller, who has been the foundation's guiding light since helping resurrect us 11 years ago (special thanks to Daryl and YVCC president Linda Kaminski).


