


**Annual Foundation Fundraiser
 Begins its Second Decade**



Beginning its second decade, this year's *11th Annual Sports Legends Reunion* will return to the Howard Johnson Friday, June 10. The doors open at 5:30 for a social, dinner is at 6:15 and the program begins at 7:00. **Pete Orgill**, longtime A.C. Davis High School head baseball coach, will be recognized as the Honored Guest. Pete was born in Idaho; his family would settle on the family farm in Grandview. By the time Pete graduated from Grandview High School he would achieve recognition as a multi-sport athlete. Athletics would be a central part of Pete's life, continuing to play baseball at both Yakima Valley College and Central Washington State College.

During this time, he would develop a great love for education and the game of baseball. He was a passionate educator, and as a coach he was driven to help kids learn to play the game and show them how dedication, commitment and being part of a team could help them in all aspects of their lives. Pete was honored in 2011 by being elected into the Washington State Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame.

Lane Phillips, a native of Lewiston, Idaho, will be the *2016 High Hopes Golf Tournament* Honorary Chairman. Lane was a member of the 1959-60 YVC Indians returning a number of years later to serve on the coaching staff. He was drafted as a pitcher by the New York Yankees and later joined the Philadelphia Phillies system (1962-65).



The tournament will feature the usual 8 a.m. shotgun scramble event Saturday, June 11. It all begins at the tournament tent with team check-in from 6:30-7:30 a.m., all the golf balls you can hit at the driving range, continental breakfast and our welcome at 7:45 a.m. We will have our popular putting strings and mulligans available, as well as contests on all par 3 holes and a \$100,000 hole-in-one opportunity. We will provide our annual "gift" for those playing and hope all will stay for the post-golf High Hopes BBQ luncheon and awards ceremony around 1:15 p.m. Extra luncheon tickets are available for your family and friends. Team pictures will be taken on the 9th and 18th tee blocks throughout the day and will be available for pick-up around 1:30.

We are honored to remember those who have passed. Many have been Parker Partners and shared our mission throughout their lives.



In memory of **Don and Joyce Bedlington**, who both were involved in PeeWee baseball during the 1960's. Don coached and Joyce supported his passion.



In memory of **Bobo Brayton**, legendary WSU Cougar baseball coach, remembered as a down-to-earth man who taught young men the game of baseball and life.





Meet Lane Phillips High Hopes Honorary Chairman

Lane Phillips has been an extraordinary lifelong athlete and coach, an avid supporter of sports programs and an active supporter of the Parker Youth & Sports Foundation. He was a star athlete at Clarkston High School and continued playing basketball and baseball at Yakima Junior College in 1959-60. He signed a pro baseball contract with the New York Yankees and was in spring training with the Philadelphia Phillies when a serious shoulder injury abruptly ended his promising pitching career.

Lane returned to Yakima, and in the early 70's he started 11 years on the YVCC athletic staff. He assisted athletic director and baseball coach Bill Faller as well as basketball coach Ellwood Crosier. Lane became the men's head basketball coach when Ellwood moved to women's basketball.

Lane left Yakima and YVCC to work 20-plus years in the jet boat industry in Idaho and California. In 2007 he retired and returned to his roots in the Lewis-Clark Valley. Since then he has regularly recruited a foursome in our High Hopes Tournament, and his teams are always contenders for the championship.

In September 2014, Lane had a medically unexplained blackout, falling and incurring a spinal cord injury, which left him wheelchair-bound. Since then Lane has worked diligently to make a comeback from being mostly paralyzed from the neck down. He continues extensive physical therapy with amazing perseverance and determination. The Parker Youth & Sports Foundation is honored and proud to have Lane as our Honorary Tournament Chairman.

Meet Pete Orgill Sports Legends Reunion Honored Guest

Pete Orgill, a great man who touched so many lives in a positive way, passed away quietly with his family and friends at his side on May 14, 2015, after a short, courageous fight with cancer.

Talk to anyone from the old Mid-Valley League in

Yakima and hear stories about the tough, knobby-kneed kid from Grandview. Being the fourth child in a loving family of eight helped make him a fierce competitor in all sports, but baseball was his first love. He excelled in baseball at Yakima Valley College and continued his baseball career at Central Washington State College. During this time, he developed a great love for education along with his love of baseball. Pete married the love of his life, Glenda.

Pete started his career at Lewis & Clark Junior High, then became a health teacher and head baseball coach at Davis High School in Yakima and loved this job for over a quarter-century. Pete always said he was a health teacher first and a baseball coach second.

He began a campaign to teach the world about heart health, specifically CPR, and how to save a life. He spent countless hours training people, organizations and the public in general. For many years, Pete led the annual CPR Blitz, at the Yakima Convention Center, where thousands of people were trained in life-saving procedures. Pete was more proud of the fact that he taught tens of thousands of people to save a life than of any of his accomplishments as a baseball coach. That is a powerful comment, as he is known as one of the finest baseball coaches in the state and was inducted into Washington State Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame in 2011.

He was a passionate educator, and as a coach he was driven to help kids learn to play the game and show them how dedication, commitment and being part of a team could help in all aspects of their lives. Pete's students and players loved him with a passion. At Pete's passing, in an impromptu show of love, the third base coaching box at Davis's baseball field was overflowing with flowers brought by many former students and players. Pete's positive mentoring will live on as he and Glenda have three children who will carry on his legacy. His son Pete is a teacher and baseball coach, and his daughter Katie Orgill Hinckley, is the very successful head volleyball coach at West Valley High School of Yakima. Pete and Glenda were very fortunate to meet a young man that touched their hearts, and Saby Martinez became their third child and part of the family.

The Washington State Coaches Association was fortunate and honored to have Pete as a member, not only as the baseball representative, but representing all sports and showing students and fellow coaches how to live the right way.
