Once she and Dale retired they began traveling. Surprisingly she was also an avid sports fan.

In memory of *Jim Leahy*, high school offensive lineman named to the Colorado Catholic All-State Honors at Lake Oswego. Jim was an offensive lineman on the Fighting Irish teams coached by Ara Parseghian. In Jim's four years (1965-68) Notre Dame lost just six games going undefeated (9-0-1) and winning the 1966

National Championship.

In memory of *Hazel Leland*, who was the Yakima city golf champion seven times and Yakima's Woman Athlete of the Year in 1958-59.

Hazel took a position at Yakima Junior College in 1957 and became the men's golf coach in 1960. Hazel's team won the 1964 state junior college tournament.

Hazel was elected to Washington State Bowling Hall of Fame in 1980.

Ken & Millie Stenjhem



In memory of *Wanda Louman*, who after graduation worked in the office of a low-cost housing complex built during World War II. Wanda loved to dance.

Her husband Jack was a professional baseball player from Yakima; returned to his baseball career after WWII

but would soon retire back to Yakima as the family grew. Wanda returned to her office/bookkeeping career working for a local real estate firm for many years before joining J.M. Perry Institute and later the accounting firm of Day, Ludwig, and Criddle.

Wanda was all about family - a sports wife to Jack who played fastpitch in the evenings and the two boys playing baseball, Wanda was in constant motion going from one game to the next.

In memory of *Jane Sarmiento Schwab*, graduated in 1958 from Yakima High, later received a bachelor's and master's degree from Central Washington University and at age 58 began a five-year course of study that led to a doctorate in American Studies from Washington

State University. Jane taught in the Yakima Public Schools for thirty years and after receiving her Ph. D. she taught at YVC

Michael Schwab



In memory of *Glen Sherar*, tabbed the "little magician" by Yakima Republic sports editor George Redmond. Coach Sherar earned the label with his remarkable success against basketball teams having a great height advantage over the Indians. The Northwest championship team of 1957 was a

prime example of Sherar's typically short but quick, highly skilled, and disciplined basketball teams.

Sherar came to Yakima Junior College in 1935 as basketball and tennis coach. He served as the college director of athletics from 1946 to 1972.

The Indians won conference basketball championships under Sherar in 1940, 1941, and 1942, and the Northwest championship in 1957. His tennis teams were conference champions twelve times and were undefeated from 1936-1943. An avid and highly skilled tennis player himself. YVCC Hall of Fame inductee 1984.

Ellwood Crosier



In memory of *Dick Sandberg*, graduated from Toppenish, and attended the University of Washington where he played football. He remained a loyal Husky fan throughout his life.

After college, he returned to Toppenish where he started the

family grocery store, Savin' Sandys, with his father Sandy and his brother Jim. He served as city councilman and mayor. He also helped found the Grid Kids football program in Toppenish.

John Staffan



In memory of *James Yearout*, joined the Army National Guard in October 1947 and was mobilized during the Korean War. He loved sports and served as President of Yakima Youth Baseball in 1974 and was a member of the Board of Directors for many years.


