Weekend Continues to Have a Loyal Following

Fourteen years ago the PY&SF Board of Directors formulated a plan to bring people together to honor local people who have achieved athletic or coaching success and supported youth programs and facilities.

A weekend concept of honoring sports legends and playing golf was created. The Friday evening Sports Legends Reunion (SLR) and Saturday High Hopes tournament was a perfect fit. Selecting one high profile former athlete as an honored guest and to draw people to a Friday night event, the Sports Legends Reunion has become a true reunion affair. YVC baseball players coached by Bobo Brayton or Bill Faller were contacted for the High Hopes golf. Approximately 40 YVC baseball alumni return each year to be a part of reliving a time in their life in Yakima while others frequently join the event.

The next step was contacting like-minded Yakima business people to sponsor one or both events. We are fortunate to live in a sports-minded community and receive outstanding support.

Contending with the confusion created when the inaugural Central Washington Sports Hall of Fame (CWSHOF) event announced it would be held on Saturday of our annual fundraiser, the Sports Legends Reunion faithful came through. The 13th annual Sports Legends Reunion drew 125 as SLR Honored Guest Mel Moore drew many from across the state who came to honor him. Mel’s contribution to sports in Yakima is well documented: his involvement in the organization of state tournaments; attendance at local sporting events year round; and received numerous service awards. On July 24th he received the Washington Interscholastic Basketball Coaches Association *Ed Pepple Service Award* for his work and support of state tournaments in Yakima.

At the Sports Legends Reunion, High Hopes Honorary Chair Stan Renecker announced that he would match any contribution to the Faller Brayton Endowment, an endowment he started in support of financially disadvantaged youth. The endowment increased \$25,000.00 due to recent pledges made at the SLR.

Mel and Stan have similar qualities – they are quiet men; care about their community; and share their time and finances so disadvantaged youth have another avenue to participate. The PYSF weekend draws many others with similar qualities.

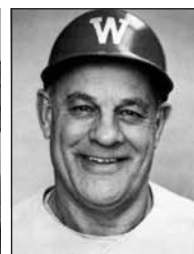

Spotlight on Local Athletes

A new addition to the newsletter is a feature to the next generation of sports legends. Some may continue on with the course established many years ago and others may have their course altered.

The spotlight in this issue is on one whose course was altered. Drew edited his spotlight.



Drew Schreiber (Eisenhower High School Class of '14) was born in Richland, Washington, but moved to Yakima when he was entering second grade. He attended middle school at Franklin, which was where he started running. His mom

wanted him to have some after school activities, and she wanted him to try something which tired him out a little, so he took up track and cross country. One of his Franklin track coaches, Joe Rodriguez, called Drew a "points machine," and he won the Sunfair Invitational Cross Country Meet in sixth grade and eighth grade. Drew chose to attend Eisenhower High School so he could run for legendary Coach Phil English. While the prospect of cross country as a freshman was a little daunting, Drew decided to go out for track in the spring of his freshman year. After that, he never looked back.

Drew went to State four times in track and three times in cross-country. As a sophomore, he was third at the state meet in the 800m, and as a junior, he was second. As a senior, Drew was a double 4A state champion in the 800m and the 1600m. His 800m time was 1:51.75, and his mile time was 4:07.32, which ranked eighth in the nation. However, his 800m PR was set at districts that year, where he ran 1:50.99, which ranked him 20th nationally at that distance. Between his junior and senior year, Drew qualified for the 2013 World Youth Trials, where he placed seventh in the 800m, clocking a 1:52.90. He also ran an indoor mile of 4:13.45 at the 2014 UW Open.

Drew's passion was for track, but he was also an outstanding cross-country runner. He was the fastest XC runner in valley history, and was XC runner of the year in the CBBN district for his junior and senior years. As a senior, Drew won the Sunfair Invitational Cross Country Meet in a time of 14:55 on the grueling three mile course. Also as a senior, Drew finished 5th at the state 4A XC meet.

Following high school, Drew was invited to the prestigious Brooks PR Invitational, where he ran a mile

PR, finishing fifth overall in 4:09.28. He was named the 2014 Gatorade Track Athlete of the Year for Washington. By the time he graduated with academic honors, Drew held 8 Eisenhower school records, all of which still stand. He was named the Yakima Valley High School Athlete of the Year in 2014.

Drew ran collegiately for UW and EWU, and, after a hiatus, he will return to collegiate running at CWU. There, he plans to major in Biological Anthropology with an emphasis in forensic science.

Historical Section

Jerry Ward has been researching and compiling information for YVC's upcoming centennial celebration. This letter is transcribed from her original letter that was written in her own handwriting. Ms. Prior was in Seattle at the time of this letter, and we can only guess she may have been taking courses or maybe teaching as she does mention 'on campus' in her letter.

Elizabeth Prior's Letter of Acceptance to Become the First Dean of YVC – by Jerry Ward

June 19, 1928



Mr. A. C. Davis
Yakima, Washington

My dear Mr. Davis:

Your telegram was a little delayed in reaching me because I was on the campus. However, you would receive my answer before noon.

In accepting I am taking a good deal of responsibility I know, and it did take a little courage to wire my acceptance. Perhaps I accept because I still have some of the spirit of adventure and pioneering, or perhaps with me it is a case of just "rushing in". In either case I shall try to make good.

I do appreciate the confidence which you and the Board have placed in me. Thank you again. However, if, after the announcement is made that you have chosen a woman, you find that the decision may not meet with approval and may work against a good enrollment, feel perfectly free to tell me and I shall understand. The school must not be hampered in the beginning.

Shall you wish me to com over right away for a conference and some work (?) I can of course come home and return here to do any work you wish, as my room is paid for anyway for a month. Please let me know. I have asked Mr. Little a good many questions and will ask more.

6 Sports Legends Reunion Highlights Foundation Sponsored Awards

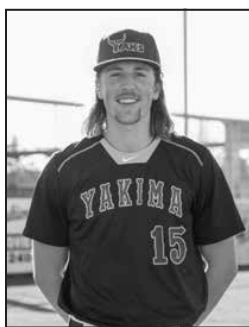

Mason Shaw is the 2018-19 recipient of the **Joe Donahue Memorial Scholarship** recipient. Mason graduated from Ferndale High School and was a starting pitcher for YVC with a 2.34 ERA. Coming out of high school, he had a 3.77 GPA and his record of solid academics has continued in college as Mason made the President's List in the

Fall Quarter and the Dean's List in the Winter Quarter. His future goals include pursuing a 4-year degree in philosophy and he is interested in becoming a youth pastor one day

The award is in honor of Joe Donahue, a charter director of the Foundation, and an officer of the original Parker Youth & Sports Foundation. The scholarship recognizes Joe's long service to youth sports in Yakima, and especially to Yakima Valley College sports programs. The award is a \$3,600.00, ½ work-study and ½ tuition grant.



Tylor Nixon

Tylor Nixon, recipient of the 2019 **Faller Brayton Coaches Award**, graduated from Corvallis High School, Corvallis, Montana. He played second base for the Yaks and was a mainstay in the lineup, helping YVC win the 2018 East Region title and finish as runners-up in the 2018 NWAC Baseball Championships. Head

Coach Kyle Krustangel commented, "Tylor is a flat-out competitor and was our only freshman starting in the championship game! He has a great work ethic and a high ceiling as a baseball player."

The purpose of the award is to recognize and reward a returning baseball player.



The **Swede Lindquist Memorial Award** was presented to the **Yakima Valley Wrestling Officials Association**. YVWOA received a \$1,000.00 check to help train and retain officials while Rojelio "Reggie" Diaz was selected to receive recognition as the association's young and upcoming official.



The **Ron Pearson Award** is a new grant established and funded by the Faller Brayton Endowment. The \$2,000.00 award is to benefit, via scholarship, those who wish to participate in the Yakima Youth Baseball program but need financial assistance.

Ron served as president of Yakima Youth Baseball (YYB) in 1973 when the program conducted a successful campaign raising \$40,000.00 to light Parker Field on the YVC campus. YYB completed other improvements that year: lowered the dugouts; added a concession stand and portable bleachers; and completed the centerfield scoreboard. In January 1974, Ron was presented the "Administrative Award" at the Washington State Coaches Clinic and Banquet for his "dynamic and inspiring leadership" in developing the Parker Field complex.

The inaugural presentation was made during the Sports Legends Reunion in order to involve his family. Son Chris provided a brief background of his father's involvement with Yakima Youth Baseball. Ron's widow Marilyn was in attendance.

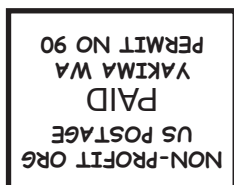
