LeAnn Leahy Named First Executive Director for Parker Youth & Sports

Parker Youth & Sports Takes BIG Step Toward Community Service with Full-Time Hire

Effective March 1, LeAnn Leahy officially started work for the Parker Youth & Sports Foundation as the first executive director for the nonprofit organization. Mrs. Leahy was formally introduced to the public at a March 28 press conference and reception appropriately held in the Parker Room on the Yakima Valley

Community College campus. LeAnn is hard at work in the Foundation's new (also a first) office located on the ninth floor of the Larson Building.

The Foundation was founded in October 2004, and swift growth supporting parks and sports facilities in the Yakima area brought the board to the crossroads. President Bill Faller states, "There are ambitious plans for parks, sports programs and play fields in the Yakima area, and these dreams call for the organization and work of a dedicated administrator and fundraiser. LeAnn is the ideal person to be the director of Parker Youth & Sports Foundation."

LeAnn has deep roots in Yakima. She was born in Vancouver, Washington, to John and Pat Wane, and the family moved to Yakima while she was still a young child. She attended Whitney Elementary, Wilson Junior High and Eisenhower High School. LeAnn graduated from the University of Portland with a degree in communication management. She traveled with her husband, Patrick Leahy, throughout the United States while he pursued a professional baseball career. LeAnn has worked in marketing, business video productions, computer software, and in the television industry. For the past four years she has been a pharmaceutical sales representative. LeAnn and Pat are the parents of two young and active children.

Daryl S. Parker, board member and the organization's founding philanthropist, states, "The work of preserving and building sports programs and facilities is outrunning a volunteer board at this time. A full-time executive director is needed to help build the community plan into the future."

PYSF Financial Report April 2007

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In February, the PYSF executive committee approved an amended 2006-2007 fiscal year budget to include an increase in revenue of a designated contribution which funds the new Executive Director positon. The budget was also amended to reflect an increase in expenses for the new position. The approved revised Foundation budget for 2006-2007 is \$149,104 in revenue and \$149,104 in expenses.

Joe Donahue Scholarship

The Foundation has established a special scholarship in honor of charter director Joe Donahue. Joe was also a director and officer in the original Parker Youth Foundation.

The scholarship recognizes Joe's long service to youth sports, and especially to the Yakima Valley Community College athletic program.

The scholarship is a tuition/work grant of \$2,400 for the 2007-08 academic year at YVCC. It will be awarded to a student planning for a career in health and physical education, athletics, recreation, or a closely related area. Graduates of high schools in the greater Yakima area and all currently enrolled YVCC students are eligible to apply.


Applications have been distributed to all of the high schools within the YVCC district and at the college. The due date for return is May 15.

5-Time Mr. Universe ~ 1950 Yakima High Graduate Bill Pearl Returns to Yakima! High Hopes Golf Tournament Honorary Chairman

The circus came to town....a young boy's dream was born...and with years of work, a legend was built. That town was Yakima, the dream was to be the world's strongest man and the legend: Five-time Mr. Universe, Bill Pearl!

Parker Youth & Sports Foundation is very proud to introduce 1950 Yakima High School graduate Bill Pearl as the honorary chairman of the 2007 High Hopes Golf Tournament on May 19. Bill Pearl is a man who broke barriers all of his life and, at the age of 76, continues to live the body-building and fitness lifestyle. He is called a "world premier physique star" and is the most wellknown of vegetarian body builders. At his peak as a body builder, when he last won Mr. Universe in 1971, he was 41 years old, weighed 242 pounds with a height of 5'10," and his arms measured 21 inches. He is the author of over 27 books on body building and fitness, and the titles of four of his books are used to chronicle his life.

"Getting Stronger" (1986) He was born on the Warm Springs Indian Reservation near Prineville, Oregon, on October 30, 1930. Bill's family soon settled in Yakima where his father owned a restaurant. The entire family worked long hours, and from an early age Bill had an intense desire to be strong and well-built. He began training at the age of 10 and lifted weights by using cans of green beans and corn as dumbbells and "pressing" sacks full of potatoes.

"Getting In Shape "(1994) Bill is recognized as one of the all-time greats of body building. In 1953, Bill took the Mr. Oceanside, Mr. Southern California, Mr. California, Mr. America and Mr. Universe titles all in one year! Bill won Mr. Universe titles in 1953, 1956, 1961, 1967 and 1971. In winning the 1953 title, he beat out a then 23-year-old Sean Connery of "James Bond" movie fame. In addition to body-building work during these competition years, Bill developed gyms, health clubs, and fitness businesses.

"Keys to the Inner Universe, An Encyclopedia on Weight Training" (1978) Since the age of 39, Bill's diet has been lacto-ovo vegetarian, which means he eats eggs and dairy products. Bill won his final Mr. Universe title in 1971 at the age of 41, without the use of steroids and as a vegetarian. Writing Keys to the Inner Universe was a project that took four years. There are now over 70,000 copies in print!

"Beyond the Universe – The Bill Pearl Story" (2003) Bill is renowned as a true gentleman and ambassador of the body-building sport. He has coached more major physique fitness contest winners than anyone else in history. He rises at 3 a.m. to train six days a week and works on his antique automobiles in his spare time. Today, Bill and his wife, Judy, reside in and enjoy the beauty and tranquility of Medford, Oregon.

In the book *Getting Stronger*, Bill states, "Weight training is one of the most versatile of all athletic activities. It is an excellent foundation for improved performance in almost every sport and can be a cornerstone in the development of good health."
