

Carol A. Finney Donates \$237,000 Endowment to PYSF for Eisenhower Softball First \$9,500 check is Presented to IKE on Valentine's Day!

o know Carol Finney is to love Carol Finney. She was a joy to be around, and had the perfect balance of enthusiasm, dedication, discipline, love, tough love and the perfect dose of gullibility. The Parker Youth & Sports Foundation honors Carol Finney and her love for her Women's Softball Team.

Carol Finney loved four things: 1. Kids. 2. IKE. 3. Youth Athletics and 4. Her Ike Softball team. Upon her passing, Carol left \$237,000 to Parker Youth & Sports that is exclusively to be used for Eisenhower's Fast Pitch and Slow Pitch Softball. The funds are held by Parker Youth & Sports Foundation in an endowment account called the Carol A Finney Endowment Fund. The fund is managed by Yakima Valley Community Foundation. Every year, on a pre-determined date, a set percent of the endowment is released to Eisenhower Girls Softball. The funds used are in addition to the Yakima School District budget for Eisenhower Girls Softball. It is anticipated spending will be used for additional or extraordinary expenses involved with the upkeep of the softball facilities and field improvements not covered by the Yakima School District. Funds may also be used for program development opportunities for the Softball programs. Parker Youth & Sports Foundation is forever grateful to Carol and to the attorneys who helped facilitate this gift. The check ceremony at Eisenhower included Carol's favorite - and frequently served, game ending treats - punch and cookies. May this unbelievable gift carry on the legacy Carol Finney.


S now castles, three story high towers, kids obstacle courses, sled races, snow sculptures of dragons-dinosaurs-knights, music, costumed skiers, light shows. evening torchlight parades of skiers and fireworks exploding in the darkened skies - all this and more await guests each year at the White Pass Winter Carnival. This is an event to put on the family-fun bucket list for the first weekend of March.

The Carnival began 35 years ago in 1985 when Dave Mahre built a small play snow castle for his daughter. Dave is the father of Olympic ski medalists Phil and Steve Mahre who grew up skiing at White Pass and are also PYSF Sport Legends in the Yakima Valley.

Each year, an amazing crew of 30 volunteers spends two weeks constructing a massive castle with three story towers, using blocks of snow and ice to build slides, bridges and tunnels. Each year, the castle features tubing and a kid's obstacle course race. While there are traditional activities every year, each year is also a new year with a new theme to ignite the imagination and costuming.

The Carnival castle is open for all guests at no charge to the public. A ticket is required for day and night skiing on the beautiful and well-groomed White Pass runs. Travel time is a short one-hour drive from Yakima on Highway 12 to see this magnificent sight.

Plan to bring warm clothes and plan for an early start to find parking. You will enter a winter wonderland that has become the best, most creative snow festival in the Pacific Northwest! Celebrating snow at the White Pass Winter Carnival will likely become your favorite winter memory!



The board of PYSF sends sympathy to the family of popular Valley Sport Legend Bill Pearl who passed away in Phoenix, Arizona on September 14, 2022. He was 91. Bill Pearl became a 5-time Mr. Universe, earning the Mr. Universe title in 1953, 1956, 1961, 1967 and finally at the age of 41, in 1971. He was honored as a PYSF Valley Sport

Legend in 2007. Bill was born on the Warm Springs Indian Reservation in Oregon and then grew up in Yakima. He worked long hours in his father's restaurant and began his weight training at the age of 10 by lifting cans of corn and sacks of potatoes. He was a football fullback at Yakima High School and graduated in1950 with the fabulous '50's class. Bill trained at YMCA with coaching legend Harvey Hunt and while authoring 11 books on health and fitness, he coached more physique stars than anyone else in the world. He was totally dedicated to health and fitness and arose each morning at 4 am for medication and exercise. He was a friendly, respectful, and inspiring Yakima Valley Sport Legend and it is our honor to have known him.
