A remarkable Coach, Teacher, Father & Friend

Bill Faller



n a beautiful fall day, the baseball and sports community of Yakima, Washington gathered at Cascade Gardens to pay tribute to the life of noble and legendary coach, Bill Faller. When Parker Youth & Sports Foundation began in 2024, - and Bill became the first president, he was 79 years old. Many people have stepped away from community involvement at that age - but not Bill. The community is thankful! We grew under Bill's leadership and with his wise influence. Our start-up donation was \$2,500. We were on a mission to make money, build funds and give grants to youth athletic organizations.

Bill was the NWAC's winningest baseball coach with 664 wins and 18 League titles and 11 conference championships while at YVC - he was also a champion football and basketball coach - and he was a national hero. During WW II he received two purple hearts as an Air Force

navigator. Daryl and Sherrie Parker knew about Bill when they successfully petitioned YVC to honor -"Bill's unprecedented benefit to the Yakima Valley," by renaming Parker Field the Parker-Faller Field in 2014. Sherrie Parker continues this tribute by sponsoring a Veteran's golf Team each year in the High Hopes Golf tournament.

While working with Bill we learned that -

Bill had a gift - he was a visionary. He could see a better future and draw up a plan on how we can get there.

He had a style - Bill was an inclusive person. He included everyone in the planning and the building. If you were at the table - you were on the team.

Bill also had friends! He could call on people to help - people answered his call. Bill was known throughout our town, state and country. He was known to be reliable, honest, hard-working and fun to work with.

Now truth be told - Bill had expectations! - He worked hard - and often worked the day into the night. He was a writer and wrote Parker Youth & Sport's first business plan with eight pages of job description detail. He cared. In fact - he cared a lot!

He was true to the mission and his team. And he expected the team to be true to do the same. Whether it was working his career or a daily task – he was a professional. Predictable with ethics.

Bill always had a direction. You loved to pick up the phone and hear it was Bill. You knew this would be a conversation that would go somewhere. If he was in the room - there would be progress.

Bill helped us all perform better. He was

a Coach and Father for everyone. Bill and his late wife Nancy raised a fabulous family with a magical brother and sisters team. Anything is possible with this group! Just give them an idea - and it will be done in a week. Remember to bring an agenda, your paper, pen, and the budget to get it done together!

If I had a wishing life - it would be that we never lose the people of importance and endearment in our life. However - often it is in middle of the biggest loss that you see the biggest hope. I believe it is Bill's hope we see - and we are now the soldiers to bring it home. All who met Bill are forever grateful they knew him.

Faith McCarty will be a sophomore at Yakima Valley College in Fall 2023. Faith assisted the game operations staff with volleyball matches and men's basketball games last year. After posting a 3.2 GPA for her freshman year, Faith is returning to YVC to complete her Associate's degree in Business. A returning student-athlete




PARADES! PRAISE! PANCAKES! OH MY!
