On November 13, 2024, the Parker Youth & Sports Board of Directors held its twentieth annual meeting to elect new board members, officers and to discuss the Foundation's needs and goals for the 2024 fiscal year. We welcomed new board member and treasurer, Jeff Parker CPA. In addition to finance skills, Jeff is an athlete and played on a state of Washington champion basketball team. Darlene Olmstead is welcomed back to the board as a new board member with several years of experience as our business services manager.

I sincerely thank the community for the terrific response to the Holiday letter offering a "High Hope's

Print" with donations of \$100 or more. It was great to see so many Parker partners reply, and your support is needed for sport awards. We hope you enjoy the unique Don Crook print!

We have experienced a season of significant loss during the past six months with the passing of four incredible men, all of whom made a gigantic impact in youth sports in the Yakima Valley. We pay tribute to the lives of these irreplaceable men - each of whom were all-star athletes in their playing days, who became coaches, administrators and leaders of successful youth organizations as adults. These men will be greatly missed.

- Dr. Bob Alexander was a youthful baseball all-star, who became the principal
 of Davis and Eisenhower High School, an Assistant Superintendent of Yakima
 Public Schools. He was the second president of Parker Youth & Sports.
- George "Spud" Edmondson all-state football player, and three sport athlete at Eisenhower High School. He played football for the Oregon Ducks and was president of Yakima Monday Morning Quarterbacks for 10 years.
- Keith Farnam was a University of Oregon basketball player who coached multiple sports and was athletic director at Eisenhower for over 30 years. He was a 30-year member of Yakima Monday Morning Quarterbacks.
- Coach Dan Eyman played football at West Valley High, YVC and EWU before becoming head football coach at Highland, Eisenhower and West Valley High. Dan was the Washington State Football Coach of the Year in 2009.

Our board is focused on achievement every year. At this time we have 28 needs listed for Yakima Valley youth athletics. Kids must be recruited into sports participation. Athletic gear needs to be replaced. In some sports, equipment standards are tougher and new

equipment is required. With budget restraints, the upkeep of many fields was postponed or neglected, and restoration is needed. The list of 28 needs have been narrowed to Five Goals for 2025 and we are at work to be 100% better in every area next year.


- Increase participation for kids in sports. Support less fortunate kids so they can play.

WELL DONE RAY FUNK 20-year Athletic Director YVC

Ray Funk is celebrating 20 years as the Athletic Director of Yakima Valley College. His job has been administration, budgets, coaching, satisfying health and athletic codes, negotiation, scheduling, hiring coaches, staff meetings, board meetings, hiring referees and recruiting, recruiting, recruiting, recruiting! A native of the Yakima Valley, Ray not only does all these things – he is very good at them! Ray received his Associate's degree from YVC in 1990, and his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1992, from Washington State University. He earned a Master's of Science degree in sports at St. Thomas University in Miami FL while doing marketing work with NBA's Miami Heat. Funk was the athletic director, head boys' basketball coach and a teacher for White Swan High School. Ray was hired as head men's basketball coach at YVC and as the YVC Athletic Director in May, 2005. He is just the fourth Athletic Director in YVC's 75-year athletic history as he follows in the legacy of Glen Sherar, Bill Faller, and Jerry Ward. Funk's record of success includes earning "A.D of the Year" and "Coach of the Year" honors and winning the 2008 Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges men's basketball championship. His athletic programs have also been named "Programs of Year" several times by the Associated Students of YVC. Funk has served on and chaired the NWAC Executive board, and he chaired many of their committees over the years. We are fortunate that he has also served on the Parker Youth & Sports Foundation board for almost 10 years.

In Ray's own words....

What was Ray's favorite part of the Athletic Directors job?

"My favorite part of the job is the people! From having an impact on the lives of student athletes to working daily with high-quality coaches, athletic staff, fellow YVC employees and NWAC personnel, this job is definitely heavy in the people business."

What has been the biggest challenge you dealt with on the job? "The biggest challenge was our department's response to the Covid-19 pandemic. Working with a host of YVC stakeholders, public health officials, and local, conference and state regulations — we were able to have an abbreviated sports season in spring of 2021 for the student-athletics. We became a model for the safe resumption of face-to-face programs at the college. An anguing challenge has been the riging costs across the entire


During his 20-year tenure at Yakima Valley, Ray had seven championship teams with four Northwest Athletic Conference (NWAC) titles and three National Collegiate Wrestling

Association (NCWA) titles. Ray initiated the YVC study table program for student athletes resulting in over 750 student-athlete's being named to the YVC President's or Dean's list of the past 10 years. Ray has had 81 of his former players go on to play at four-year universities, and six went on to play professionally. 8 of his former assistant coaches went on to become head basketball coaches. Since Ray started, the YVC athletic department budget has increased by 99 percent. His ambition to improve fundraising and department revenues has led to amazing improvements for every YVC field and facility. Ray and Lonni, his wife of 24 years – have one adult son, Trey, who is a recent graduate of Washington State University. Job well done AD Ray Funk!





Facts To Lead To Solutions

There is a vital need for affordable athletic programs and equipment for youth in Yakima County.

- 1. 69% of the Yakima County children enrolled in schools live in economically subsidized homes.
- 2. 73.4% of the children in Yakima County schools are enrolled in the free and reduced lunch program.
- 3. In fact, 50 of the Yakima County's 104 schools have 100% of the children in the schools enrolled in the free and reduced lunch program.
- 4. A language other than English is spoken in 42% of the homes compared to a state average of 21% of the homes.
- 5. 51% of our population is of Hispanic or Latino origin in Yakima County.
- 6. 49% of the children live in high poverty neighborhoods.
- 7. 78% of the births in Yakima County are paid for by Medicaid compared to 35% of births in Washington State - and 41% of births in the U.S.
- 8. We are a young county with 29% of the population age 18 or younger compared to the Washington State and U.S. average of 21% being 18 or under.
- 9. 24% of our population is without a high school degree, compared to 8% in Washington State.
- 10. Approximately 4000 children are born each year in Yakima County.

We are a county with hard-working, dedicated, and generous citizens. Statistical data tells us that Yakima County is challenged by poverty, language barriers, adult educational levels, crime, and inadequate availability of literacy experiences for the population, Partiauarly at-risk youth are children from low-income families whose dominant language spoken in the home is other than English. For coaches, parents and volunteers it can be overwhelming to build a team, fill the needs, and still play the game. However, by working togetherrelying on each other - showing up for others when they need help, we can build the field of many dreams!

10 VITAL STEPS IN BUILDING A STRONG ATHLETIC PROGRAM **10-YEAR TIMELINE TO EXCELLENCE!**

"Do what is best for the program, the players, and participants in the long run."

Are you or a family member involved with an athletic program? You may be just beginning, in the middle of program planning, or working hard to maintain a productive status. Whatever the level of your participation, it is always the right time to build or rebuild an athletic program, to keep it financially healthy and become the best it can be. It is essential for all involved to understand that real change will take time and an honest commitment to the athletic program. This article is about building a program for a long run plan. Coach Fran O'Brien from M.I.T. concluded: "Building a solid program takes 10 years."

Coaches and managers need to know that athletes and the public aspire to know two things:

- Their coaches and leaders are committed to the program through thick and thin for years to come.
- They want to be part of something great!

A program with a strong foundation takes time to build, but once in place it will pay dividends. Here are 10 recommended and practical steps to building a strong athletic program for youth or adults.

- CHANGE: Change the practice and meeting routines. Have athletes do what they like to do and change whatever needs to 1. change. Instruction and practice should be technically sound, stimulating, and designed to keep everyone busy.
- 2. ATTITUDE: Check the participant's attitude. Bad-attitude athletes or participants must leave. Build a program and tradition focused on respect, trust and focused team success. No one is allowed to spoil the activity for anyone.
- 3. RELATIONSHIPS: Establish a positive relationship with the athletic directors, schedulers and your organization's sponsors. Keep the games and activity schedule challenging with opportunities for growth and success.
- 4. DISCIPLINE: Reinforce discipline as a goal for players and participants. Discipline, like physical fitness, can lead to victories. Athletes get to have fun and still have a meaningful time if they make a pledge to teamwork, sportsmanship, pride and honor.
- 5. CHALK TALK & MONEY TALK: Talk to athletes and participants about your sport or program. Know your budget and financial limits, supervise and discuss the budget and cash flow. Be timely with payments. Share the history, techniques, strategies and traditions of your program. These talks increase their confidence, knowledge and enthusiasm.
- 6. GOALS: Set realistic and positive goals. Most athletes have goals, and everyone has a mindset of achievement. Whether it's a bad day or week, adjust the goals. Put a time limit on disappointments and then find the sunrise in the situation. Every day is the start of a new week.
- 7. ALWAYS COACH: Never Stop coaching, In good times or tough times - never stop coaching, calling plays, giving direction and guidance. Be Available. Stay positive. Be a rolemodel.
- 8. INGENUITY: Add new things each year as proof the program has agility, is improving, and is staying current. A new batting machine, seminar with a professional player, or a new tournament scheduled. Innovation creates energy and can make everyone feel more hopeful.
- ASSISTANTS: Carefully select assistants that are positive, well-liked by the 9. players and other participants, and who follow the coaches' and organization's philosophies. As stated earlier, bad or self-centered attitudes must leave to protect programs that exist for kids.
- 10. TEAM TIME: Plan an event or special occasion to end the preseason. End the preseason and begin the real season with an activity that all can afford and look forward to. Choose an activity, trip, overnight that can build comradery. Teammates sharing a good memory together will rally together during the season.

In Summary - "A coach or leader of an athletic organization never goes wrong if they base their decisions on what is best for the program and the players or participants in the long run." HEROES REMEMBERED








Bob was fondly called "Dr. Bob" by students and parents. He was a lifelong athlete and educator of youth who served Yakima students for 30 years. Bob grew up in Seattle, where he met his wife Michele in the 9th grade. He played basketball and baseball at Roosevelt High and then attended the University of Washington, where he played baseball. Bob then received a baseball scholarship to play for Seattle Pacific University where he earned his degree. He received his Master's Degree from CWU and his Doctorate at Oregon State University. He was hired as an English teacher for Davis High. With his quick wit, enthusiasm for student success, and support of parent involvement in the schools, he was promoted to principal at Davis and then at Eisenhower High School. In 1989, Bob was promoted to Assistant Superintendent of Yakima Schools. He was the second president of Parker Youth & Sports and served on the board for 10 years. We appreciate that Bob shared his administrative skills, analytical thinking, positive disposition and dedication to youth with Yakima Valley organizations.


GEORGE "SPUD" EDMONDSON (1946-2024)



Spud was born in Yakima to Mer and former City of Yakima Mayor Betty Edmondson. He was an all-state football player, and starred as a basketball, and baseball player at Eisenhower High School. He was the co-captain of the Eisenhower 4A State Champion football team in the fall of 1964, which concluded with the final game taking place in Yakima against Davis, with these two unbeaten teams. The game of all lifetimes drew a crowd of 7,500 and was a battle that Eisenhower won. Spud played football for the University of Oregon Ducks under the Hall of Fame football coach, Len Casanova — the winningest football coach in Oregon history. Spud served the public and State of Washington as a probation and parole officer until his retirement. He was a member of the board of Parker Youth & Sports for several years and chaired the golf tournaments. Spud was the dedicated president of Yakima Monday Morning Quarterbacks for ten years. Spud met his wife Gay at work and they shared a life of adventures, great people and unmatched friendships. Spud made a positive difference for the youth every day of his life.




KEITH FARNAM (1931-2025)





Keith was a University of Oregon basketball player who taught and coached multiple sports at Eisenhower for 30 years. He was also IKE's Athletic Director for 10 years and was a 30 year member of - Yakima Monday Morning Quarterbacks Club. It seemed the world was his army, and he was the general. Keith had ideas, energy and salesmanship to pull projects together and get things done. As head basketball coach, he led the Cadets to the state playoffs three times in the '60's. His 1964-65 squad is among the best in the school's history. Keith coached baseball, basketball, boys & girls tennis, softball, and cross country at IKE. He worked as an official for football, basketball and baseball for many years and was a president of the Big Nine Conference. After graduating from Oregon, Keith served in the army and then began a teaching career in Oregon before moving to Yakima. While in college, he married his junior high girlfriend, Barbara. Students throughout the Yakima Valley benefited from the work of Keith Farnam who specialized in sports, humor, fitness, and motivation.
